2.2. Venue Overview

The competition will be held at “Schwimm- & Sprunghalle im Europasportpark” (SSE) in Berlin. The 3.000 seat facility features a 10 lane 50m competition pool and a 10 lane 50m warm-up pool.

2.3. Traveling to Berlin

By Plane

Berlin Brandenburg Airport (BER) is the nearest airport, located approximately 60 minutes (26km) from the venue. Transfers will be arranged upon arrival at this airport for delegations whose reservations at one of the official hotels have been made through and confirmed by the Local Organizing Committee.

By Train

Berlin offers excellent rail connections from across Germany and Europe. The following long-distance stations provide convenient access to the venue and the official hotels. Considering Berlin's city traffic, it is recommended to take the S-Bahn or tram to "Landsberger Allee" station, which is located directly opposite the venue and close to the official hotels. Transfers from one of the railway stations mentioned below may be arranged upon request for delegations whose reservations at one of the official hotels have been made through and confirmed by the Local Organizing Committee.

Berlin Central Station (Hauptbahnhof)

Berlin Central Station is Berlin's main railway hub, welcoming trains from all major German and European cities. The venue is easily accessible within approximately 25 minutes by tram lines M8 or M5. Transfer by car is 25 to 35 minutes (8km).

Berlin East Station (Ostbahnhof)

Berlin East Station offers excellent connections for guests arriving from eastern regions. The venue is conveniently accessible within approximately 15 minutes by taking the S3, S5 or S7 to Ostkreuz and continuing on the S8, S42 or S85. Transfer by car is 15 to 25 minutes (4km).

Berlin Gesundbrunnen

Berlin Gesundbrunnen serves as an important northern gateway to the city, with frequent long-distance and regional train services. From Gesundbrunnen you can take the S41 and reach the Venue in just 7 minutes. By car the venue is reachable in 15 to 20 minutes (6km).

Please note: if you arrive at any airport or station not listed above, the LOC will not be able to offer transportation to the hotel/venue. You will need to make your own way to one of the listed airports or stations to access LOC-provided transportation. Otherwise, you will need to arrange your own travel to the hotel/venue.



2.4. Visas

Should an athlete no longer be able to attend, withdrawals are only permitted according to the WPS Rules and Regulations. Medical Withdrawals require a Medical Withdrawal form submitted to the WPS contact for confirmation.

3. SPORT ENTRIES

3.1. Athlete Eligibility

Swimmers must:

- hold an active World Para Swimming license for the Season 2026.
- be entered by their NPC or NF.
- the NPC being a good standing member of IPC and must have no outstanding invoices with WPS. Any outstanding invoices must be paid prior to entry confirmed
- be 12 years of age or older by 31st December in the year of the competition

To compete in Para Swimming World Series finals, an athlete must have an International Classification status of Review (R), Fixed Date Review (FDR) or Confirmed (C). Any athlete on a New (N) Status not undergoing classification in the competition may only swim in heats and will not progress to finals.

3.1. Entries

No late entries will be accepted.

3.2. Competition Format and Programme

Para Swimming World Series events are run under Multi class competition format for both heats and finals. Points are determined using the World Para Swimming Points System.

For all Para Swimming World Series events the current World Para Swimming Rules and Regulations apply. They can be found on the World Para Swimming website (see Swimming – Rules & Regulations – Rules).

- Heats
 - 10 lanes will be used
 - Heats will be seeded by entry time
 - Warm up time: 07:30
 - Heats start time: 09:00
- Finals
 - 8 lanes will be used
 - Finals will be seeded by Points
 - Warm up time: 15:30
 - Finals start time: 17:00
 - The highest points scoring athletes in each event as determined by WPS Points system will be eligible for finals



Finals shall be formatted and prioritized in the following order:

- World Series Final A (1-8 Placed on Points)
- World Series Youth Final (1-8 placed on points scores of Youth athletes not in the A final).
- B Final (9-16 placed on points scores of athletes not involved in youth final)
 - Youth and B finals will only take place if more than four (4) athletes are eligible and available for the start list of the respective final, excluding those already places in the A final.
 - Youth Final age group eligibility is 18 years and under (age at 31st December of competition year)

Finals priority order is outlined below

- Where a swimmer has made the A finals and Youth final, they will only be entered into the A final. The A final will be prioritized over Youth and B final.
- Where a swimmer has made the B finals and Youth final, they will be only entered into the Youth Final. The Youth final will be prioritized over the B final.

If necessary, a swim-off may be used to determine swimmers for an individual final, where point scores are equal, unless the swimmers are the same class then the fastest swimmer shall progress

Where possible there will be 2 reserve swimmers for A finals only.

Direct finals will be in place for events with 8 or less entries, as per the WPS Rules and Regulations 10.10.1.2.1.

- WPS have implemented an exception to this rule for 50m Breaststroke and 150m Individual medley events to support development of a heat opportunity for lower class athletes.

4. COMPETITION INFORMATION

4.1. Competition Venue

The detailed venue plan will follow at a later date.

4.2. Parking

Parking is available all around the competition venue. For the venue's car park a parking permission is needed. Because of the small size of the parking venue the parking permission will be given only to wheelchair users or athletes with severe walking disabilities travelling with their own car. For parking permissions please contact the LOC via email. Parking Permissions can be picked up at the accreditation.

4.3. Training

Training will take place at both pools inside the SSE Berlin

Training times are below:

Training Dates: 04 - 06 May 2026

Morning: 09:00 - 12:30

Afternoon: 14:00 - 18:00



Lane markings will be clearly displayed on the poolside outlining specific classification lanes, e.g. VI lane, S1-4 Lane.

In the competition pool on training days, lanes 0 and 9 are reserved for classification.

4.4. Warm Up/Swim Down

Warm up on competition days for heats and finals is available in the competition pool and warm up pool.

Warm up times in the competition pool are below:

- Heats: 07:30 - 08:45
- Finals: 15:30 - 16:45

All athletes must follow the warm up signage in place for the safety of all swimmers. Warm up lane allocations will also be shared in the technical meeting.

The warm up pool stays open till half an hour following the finish of the session for swim down.

4.5. Technical Meeting

The Technical Meeting will take place on **06 May 2026**. Time and Place will be confirmed at a later date.

Technical Meeting presentation will be circulated to attending NPCs in advance of the meeting to prepare any questions.

Any equipment that is required to be checked by Technical Officials can be taken to the technical meeting and checked at the end of the meeting.

4.6. Call Rooms & Competition

There will be two (2) call rooms:

1- 100m Call Room located on pool deck (TBD)

2- 50m and 150m Call Room located on pool deck (TBD)

It is the responsibility of the athlete to report to the Call Room in line with WPS Rules and Regulations.

Regulations outlined in the World Para Swimming Rules and Regulations concerning swimwear will apply; swimwear (caps, goggles and swimsuits) must be from the approved list and might be checked in the call room. Athletes will be escorted from the Call Room onto the pool deck.

4.7. Sport Information Desk (SID)

A Sport Information Desk will operate at the competition venue on the days of competition, as well as during any scheduled training sessions. It is the primary and only point of distribution for all event related information including the following:

- Distribution of start lists for the NPCs (digital only);
- Official communication with teams;
- Official forms distribution (Relay Declaration Form, Protest Form, Medical Withdrawal Form);
- Liaison between teams and LOC / World Para Swimming.

4.8. Accreditation

All athletes and team staff require accreditation to enter the venue and competition areas.

4.9. Classification

Classification Dates: 04 - 06 May 2026

This competition offers international classification for the following impairment types:

- Physical Impairment (PI)
- Vision Impairment (VI)
- Intellectual Impairment (II) (TBC)

World Para Swimming will schedule athletes with a New or Review status pursuant with the below regulations.

An athlete will only be permitted to undergo International Classification if he or she:

- Is licensed with World Para Swimming for the 2026 Season
- Has been entered into the competition by the classification entry deadline;
- The NPC has submitted their athlete priority list prior to the classification entry deadline

It is NPC responsibility to enter the required events for Classification observation purposes for the athlete in the Entry by Name. Details of which minimum events can be used for observation are below:



Physical Impairment (PI):

At least 100m S stroke (Freestyle, Backstroke or Butterfly) and
100m Breaststroke for SB4-9 classes or 50m Breaststroke for SB1-3 classes

Intellectual Impairment (II):

200m Freestyle or 100m Backstroke and
100m Breaststroke

Official posting of Classification results will be printed and posted in venue at a designated area. The classification team will notify NPCs of this location upon check in to classification. Results will be emailed to Team leaders for a secondary notification, however, please note the official posting time will be in venue.

4.10. Ice Baths, Massage Tables & Race analysis

Ice baths will not be available. A registration is necessary to do physiotherapy or massages. Areas will be foreseen for these kinds of treatments.

There is a race analysis area on the second level on the athletes' site of the venue. Tables and power plugs will be available earliest from Wednesday, 06 May 2026.

Please do not use the glass doors in the race analysis area as an exit, as they are alarm-secured.

5. VICTORY CEREMONIES

Medal ceremonies will take place throughout finals or at the end of finals and will be listed in the timeline for each evening.

World Series Medals to be awarded to the three highest points scorers in the World Series A final per event.

World Series Youth Medals to be awarded to the three highest points scorers of youth athletes across all finals per event.

WPS Minus one rule will be implemented where applicable as per the WPS Rules and Regulations.



6. ANTI-DOPING AND MEDICAL INFORMATION

6.1. Anti-Doping

The Anti-Doping control / processes will be carried out in full accordance with the IPC Anti-Doping Code and the IPC Doping Control Agreement.

6.2. Medical Services at the Venue

Lifeguards, medical team and ambulance (on call) are available for teams on site.

6.3. Insurance

Each NPC must ensure that all members of their delegation are appropriately insured, including coverage for travel, liability, accidents and repatriation. All delegation members must have appropriate accident and health insurance accepted in order to compete. The LOC will provide only basic medical services in the venue

No medical insurance will be provided to any of the participants. All participants are responsible for obtaining their own medical insurance (including Repatriation Coverage) and will be responsible for any medical expenses resulting from participation in the event.
